I also found a discussion thread (link below) where people are talking about what they think might be happening. We need to actually resolve the main discussion point and then move on. As we cannot resolve this issue any further, my recommendation is to disable the plugin until it is investigated. Personally I don't think it is worth the risk for most people. The plugin has a few minor bugs and it is not well tested. I don't recommend it to anyone who is using a production website. If a website is considered to be an important part of your business than it is better not to risk this plugin. If you install and activate this plugin, you can just deactivate it again. D. C. Thomson David Colin Thomson FRSE (12 May 1921 – 19 April 2002) was a Scottish mathematician who was a distinguished

professor of mathematics at the University of Dundee from 1965 to 1989 and the author of numerous books and articles in mathematics, statistics, and applied mathematics. He has been described as "the best-known and most highly regarded of Scottish mathematicians". He was president of the Royal Society of Edinburgh from 1995 to 1996. Life David Thomson was born in Stevenston, Ayrshire, the son of a local laird. He was educated at Stewart's Melville College and then studied Mathematics at the University of Glasgow. He then moved to the University of Dundee where he obtained his doctorate in 1950. His dissertation, The Methods of Mathematical Physics, investigated the mathematical theory of partial differential equations. He is best known for his textbook, Introduction to Mathematical Statistics which has been reissued several times. He also contributed to the Encyclopædia Britannica, contributed articles to a number of scientific journals, and wrote a popular book on the history of

probability. His last book, Methane and other industrial gases, was published posthumously. He was awarded the Order of the British Empire for services to industry in the New Year Honours List 1980. Family He married Betsy May of Douglas, Isle of Man in April 1945, they had two daughters, Soraya and Lorna. Awards He was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh in 1969.
